BIS Literacy and Numeracy Review

- ☐ Part of the Skills for Growth strategy
- ☐ Not clear what qualifications are in scope
- ☐ FAB/JCQ have queried what are we trying to achieve
- Qualifications need to meet needs of different learners
- Application or functionality a design feature



Implementation of Wolf Report

- ☐ GCSE Maths and English as a requirement?
- Some scope for Level 2 Maths and English qualifications
- ☐ The driver of the performance tables
- ☐ Shaping of 16 19 programme
- ☐ The future of Foundation Learning



Apprenticeships

- □ Key Skills retained but only until September 2012
- Will Functional Skills ever meet employers' needs?
- What will 16 19 apprenticeships look like?
- ☐ And what about Higher Level apprenticeships?
- And Pre- or Access to Apprenticeship programmes?



Foundation Learning

- ☐ Is it going to survive?
- ☐ DfE looking at current practice
- ☐ Anticipate proposals in the autumn
- ☐ Future of funding for adult provision uncertain



UKBA and **ESOL**

- Restriction on student immigration now in place
- Major limitations on Citizenship route
- Introduction of new 'educational oversight bodies'
- Independent Schools Inspectorate having oversight of QCF/NQF and ESOL providers



So is there any certainty?

- ☐ GCSE Maths and English a key measure at Key Stage 4 and probably 16 19
- Functional Skills here to stay
- Working on the assumption that they will replace Key Skills and Skills for Life
- What role for other 'stepping stone' qualifications and Level 2 equivalents?
